

Lori's natural network of friends gives her confidence to live independently

Cha-Ching\$\$\$!!!! Wondering what that sound is? It's Lori Foster cashing in on her new life!

If you had met Lori five short months ago, you would be amazed at how much she has accomplished in developing a meaningful life for herself thus far. In just a short time Lori has established a new home for herself, volunteer roles at three local organizations, and most importantly she has developed a solid social network.

Lori has allowed us to share her story in the hope that it gives other people the courage to do the same.

It all started when Lori took the big leap from living at home to living independently...

When Lori first moved to her new apartment, she was concerned that only her current vocational services would be available. She really had hoped for assis-

tance with items such as shopping, budgeting, laundry, etc., to help with her transition to independent living.

Thankfully, Lori was able to access funding which enabled her to hire her own support worker.

During this time Lori went through the ups and downs that we all do, but she also began to develop relationships with neighbours in her building. Before long, she found that she was doing a lot of day-to-day tasks with her new friends Al, Marv, Melonie, Gina, and Lynn, like: grocery shopping, laundry and running errands. Lori's friends even helped her adopt her new kitten, Manson, so that she wouldn't be lonely.

Often, when you drop by to visit with Lori you can find her in the gazebo at her new apartment complex hanging out with her new friends and it's easy to see that they have a reciprocal relationship. They are all people who care about Lori, and most importantly they see value in having Lori as their friend. Lori has created a social network that keeps her safe, healthy, happy and that gives her a real sense of what truly belonging really feels like.

The most eye opening part of watching Lori's relationships evolve is that we had nothing to do with it. What we've learned from this is the support from Supported Independent Living may have facilitated the beginning of these relationships, but the connections were natural. Lori's friends saw a woman in need, not a needy woman, and rose to the occasion.



Lori's dynamic social network of friends say they are richer today for knowing Lori and for having her as a friend. If you ever see Lori with her friends, be sure to stop and say, "hello" because she could not be prouder of the woman she has become, and of the people she has in her life who care, admire and respect her, with whom she can share wonderful new experiences. Lori is truly an inspiration.
